MATERIALS AND INSPIRATION



The art should have meaning, significance, celebrate, &/or can tell a story about:

- What the public works departments do, the tools they use, the specific tasks they perform
- Central oregon natural environment, topography, climate, natural features
- History of this place, its change over time

The art is ideally integrated into the design of the campus through:

Materials, scale, language, intentionally contrasting or complementary

The art can/should be abstract, be interactive, can change, be discoverable, can teach, can employ a variety of materials, colors, and integrate lighting








AREAS FOR PUBLIC ART

There are three major areas for public art to be integrated on campus.



A | HEADQUARTES LOBBY AND TERRACE Current Call to Artists

B | ENTRY AND SOUTH STREET EDGE SCULPTURAL ELEMENTS

Art will be integrated at the main entry at the north and at the south edge of the site, both to be viewed from public vehicular and pedestrians on Cooley and Talus.



C | SITE STRUCTURES
