

The five columnar display cases line the side of the long light-filled Galleria that brings the public into the Loveland Public Library. Each case has a built in vitrine with a locking front door. The glass-enclosed display space is 21" wide x 19 " deep x 69" high. The photo on the left below shows most of the cases and the photo on the right shows one of the cases from the front.



In the most traditional use of the space the Art Selection Committee chooses one or more three-dimensional pieces for the platform and one or more paintings to hang on the back wall of the space as shown, but less traditional options are welcomed. We give special attention to submissions that creatively make use of the full space available. Selections since 2013 have included a blown glass installation that used the full height of the case and fiber art that was specifically designed to fill the entire back wall of a case.



Please note that we are required to hang work with 3m Command-style removable strips or hooks that do not damage the finished wood of the case. So far such hanging systems have a weight limit of 8 pounds for art with a wire hanger on the back, or 16 pounds for art with a sturdy flat back that can accept velcro-style hangers.
