PROJECT DESCRIPTION

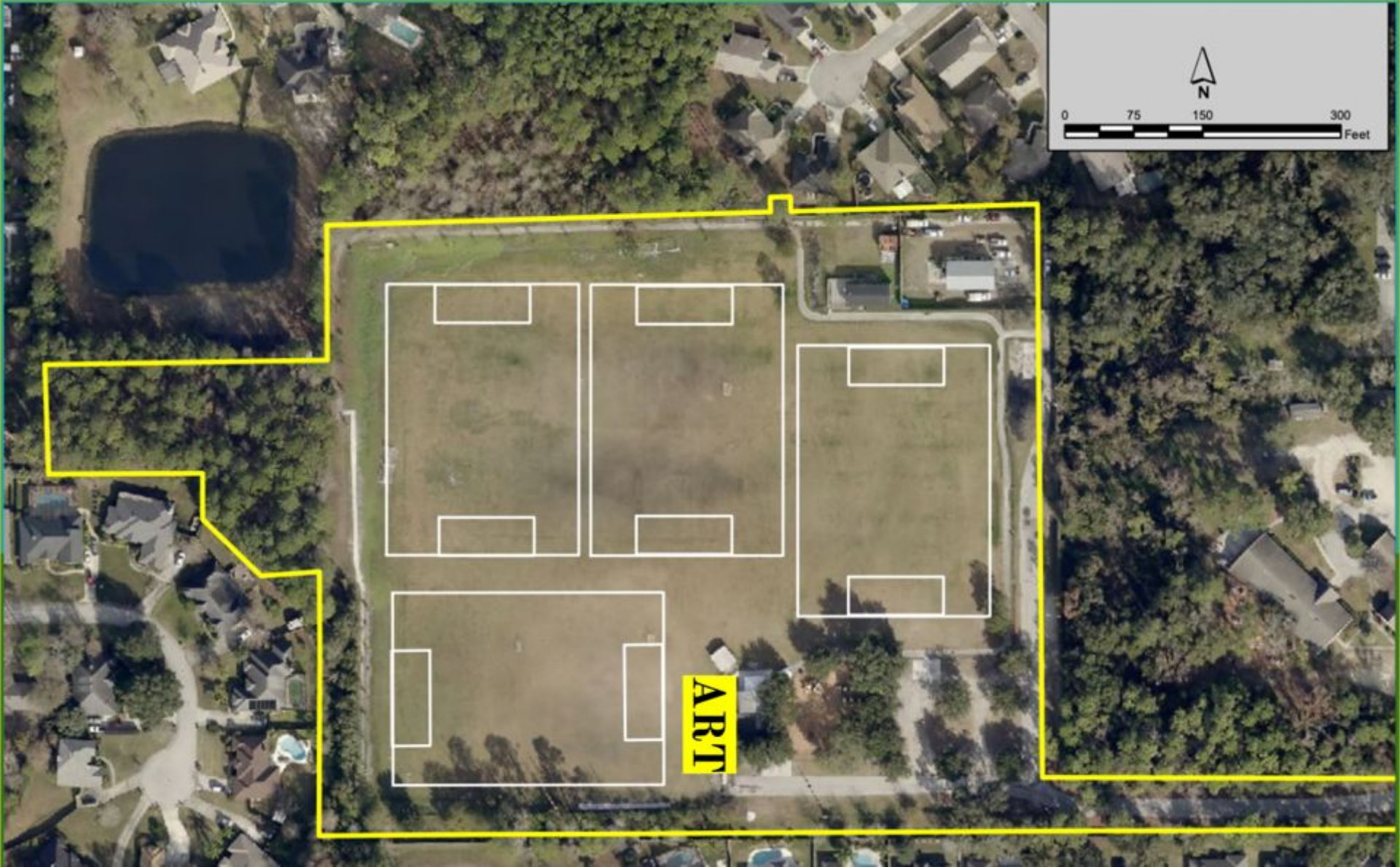

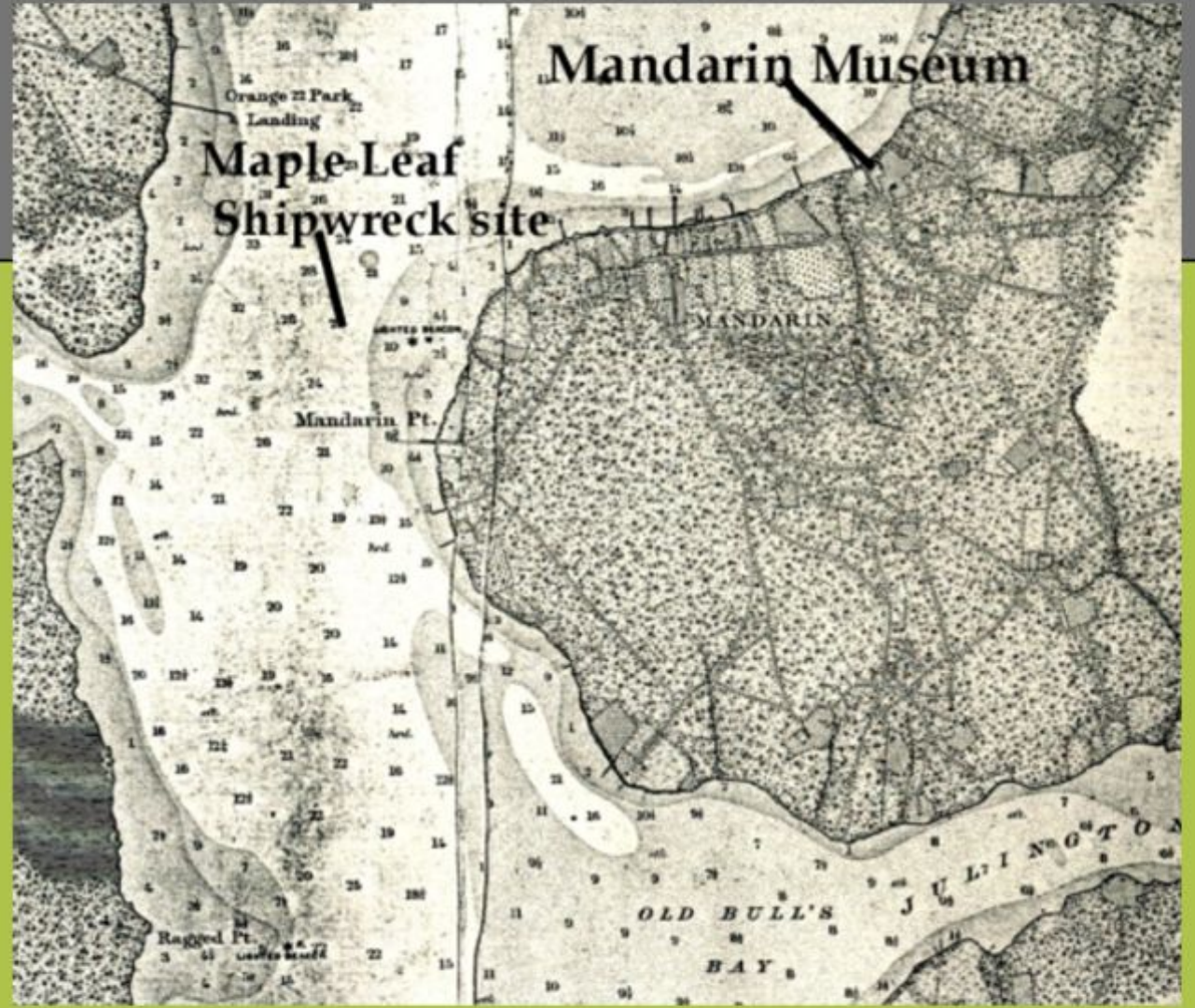
