



I - 94 MODERNIZATION

Public Art for the Cass Avenue Bridge – RE-OPENED



PROJECT CONTEXT

The I-94 Modernization Project includes 67 bridges, multiple service interchanges, and two system interchanges at M-10 (Lodge) and I-75 (Chrysler) freeways.

The Cass Avenue bridge, part of the I-94 Modernization Project, is in Midtown, one of Detroit's most dynamic and evolving districts. The bridge connects the downtown and Midtown cultural and educational districts to the south with the New Center research and technology district to the north.

OPPORTUNITIES

Land Approaching the Bridge –

Southwest corner for placemaking and public art. Artists may affect the entire space and influence landscaping.

Barrier walls and fencing are necessary on two sides, north and west, to enclose the site for public safety. Flat area measures 20-feet x 90-feet.

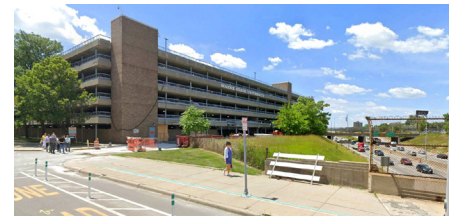
On the Bridge –

Barrier walls along the pedestrian sidewalk feature inset panels 1'-9" (H) x one-inch deep that run the length of the bridge on both sides for a total of 398-linear-feet, or 696 square feet for artwork.

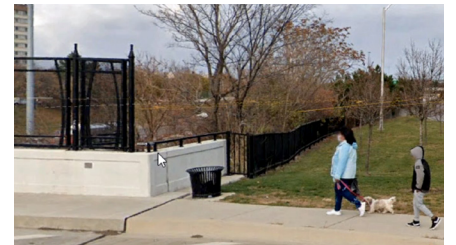


Placemaking Opportunity – Land Approaching the Bridge

Southwest Corner Site measuring 20-feet x 90-feet

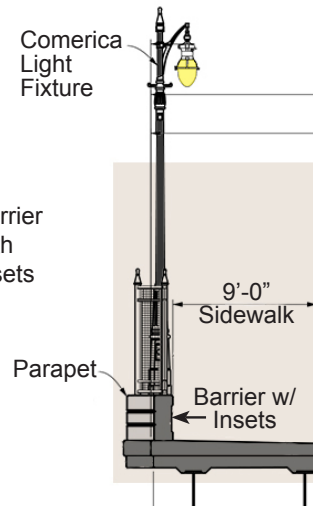
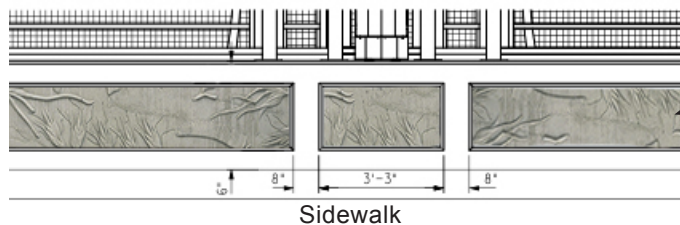
